WHEN IT COMES TO GOLF, America leads the way. No other country comes close, as can be seen from the map of the world on this page, in which each country has been resized depending on how many golf courses it possesses (also notable are the bulging U.K. and Japan, and some other hideously withered regions of the world). Though about half of the planet's golf courses and golfers are American, the headline news from the National Golf Foundation in January was that in 2006, for the first time in six decades, the U.S. ended the year with fewer golf courses than it had at the start. With plenty of supply—16,000 courses—and too many other pesky demands on our precious time, it's perhaps no surprise that the game is flatlining in these parts.

Elsewhere, however, things are booming. After years of dormancy under communist rule, golf is starting to grow in eastern Europe and the former Soviet states. Russia has doubled its golf course tally since our last Planet Golf survey two years ago (admittedly from a small start—the world's biggest country now has a grand total of six courses); Ukraine, the most populous nation without any courses two years ago, has finally gotten off the tee; and the number of golfers and golf courses in eastern Europe has tripled since the start of the millennium, according to a recent KPMG report. Asia has been extraordinarily busy, too. "If it weren't for

Asia," says one U.S.-based golf course developer, "we'd have nothing to do." Great predictions are being made especially for China, which has an estimated 310 courses compared to 230 two years ago—despite a continuing government ban that officially, theoretically, prevents any new ones from being built.

Below, in our fifth Planet Golf survey, is Golf Digest's ranking of the top-100 courses outside of the United States. Thirty countries are represented (Scotland leads with 14 courses), and we have a new No. 1. The 2005 leader, the Old Course at St. Andrews, has been deposed by the rugged, tough and beautiful Royal County Down, a timeless stretch of pure, Irish linksland first laid out by Old Tom Morris in 1889. At the other end of the timescale, the list includes some terrific new layouts such as Punta Espada in the Dominican Republic (No. 77) and Sand Golf Club in Sweden (No. 82)—these outstanding rookies are sure to make their presence felt in future rankings.

We also rank the best courses in every individual golfing country, territory and dependency around the world—197 of them in all.
